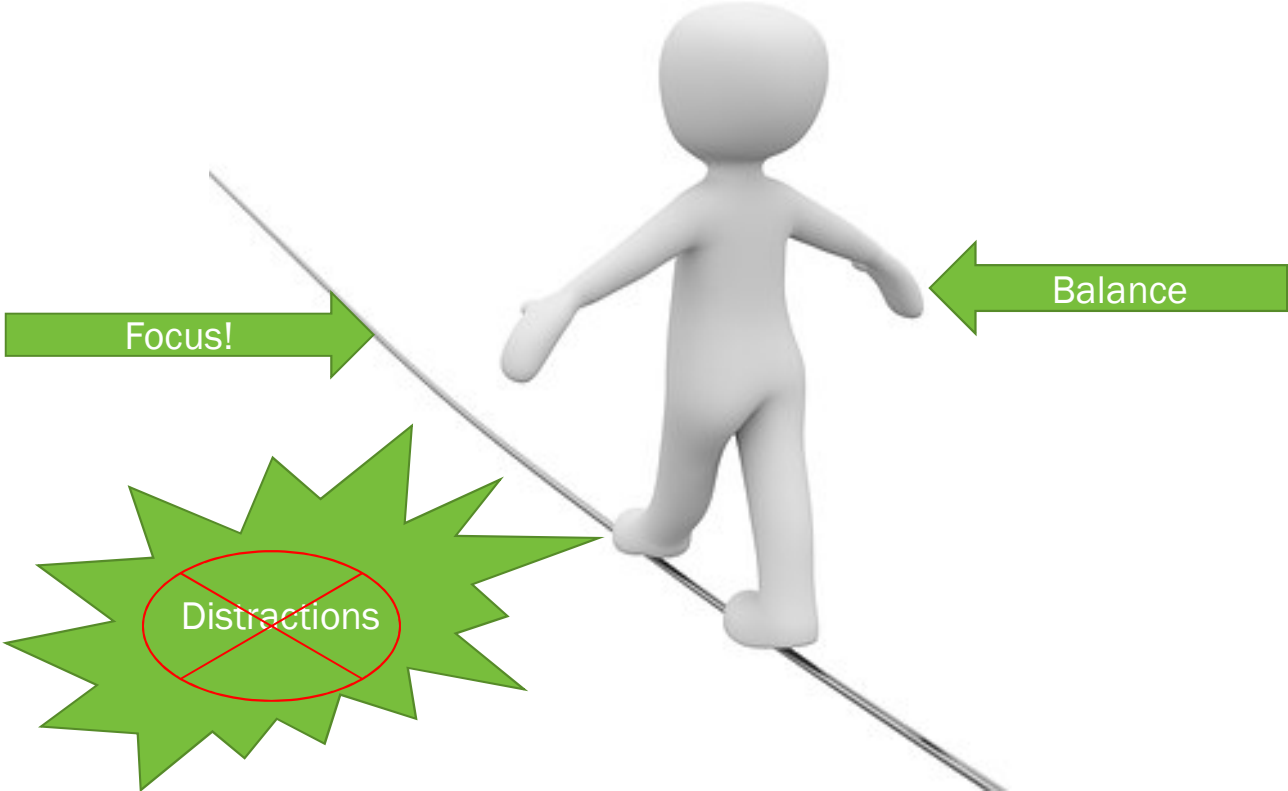

What is so great about Agile Dev?

- » Iterative delivery
 - › Break work down into small, deliverable pieces
- » Design decisions made at “Last Responsible” moment
 - › Get started delivering early
- » Rapid, Regular feedback
 - › From Stakeholders
 - › From Testers?
- » Build a Delivery Cadence

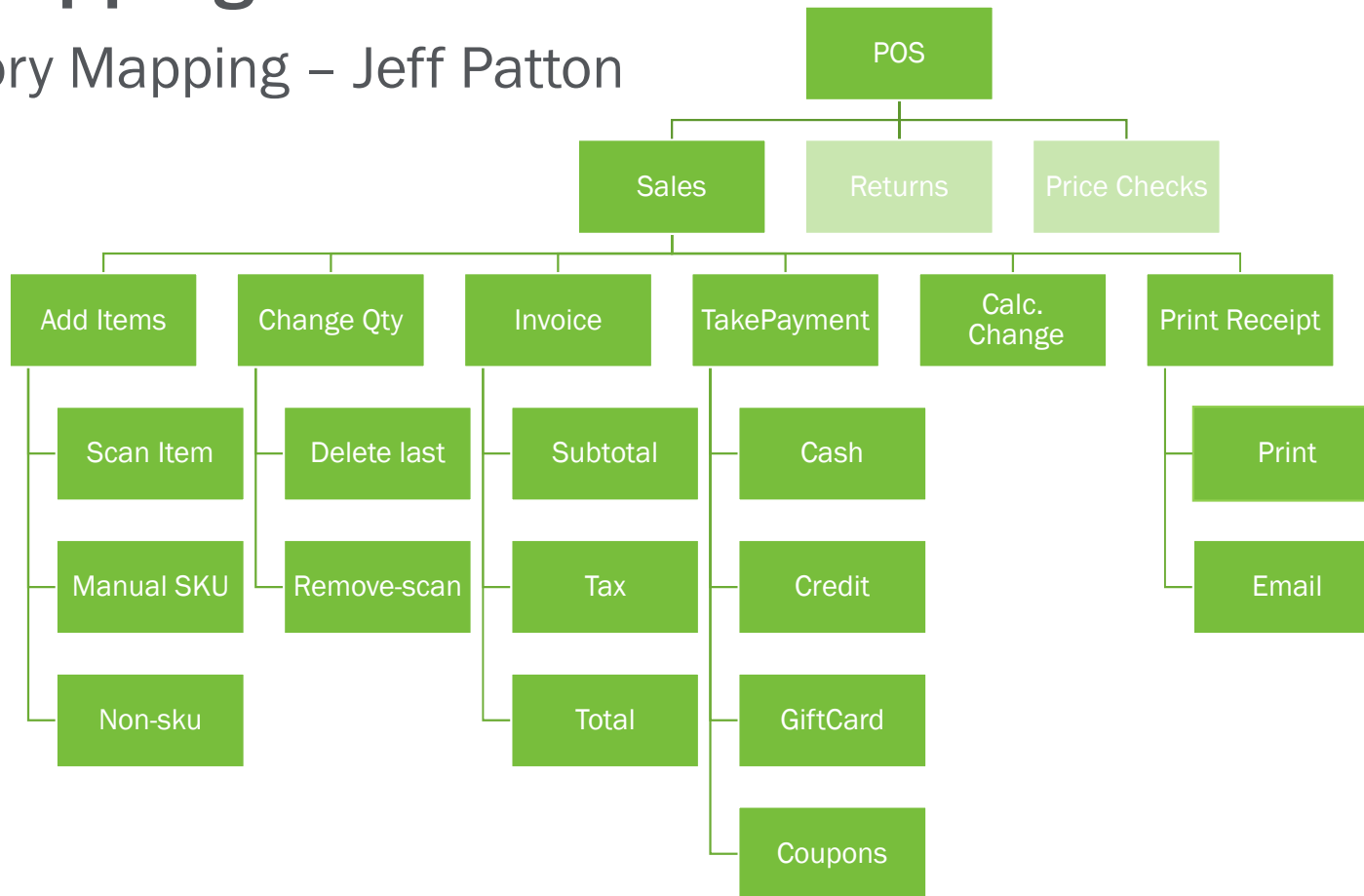
- » All are Opportunities for Focus

Distractions vs Focus

- » Incomplete Flow Functionality
- » Long Flows
- » Complicated Flows
- » UI vs Business Logic Testing

- » Look at Location of Business Logic
- » Look for “Data at Rest”

- » Evolve Your Test Cases

Testing and Automation

- » Is Automated Testing part of Done?
- » Delay Automation... Why?
 - › Lag Sprint
 - › “Until the software is stable”?

Tools and Technology Stack

- » Test Case Management
 - › Traceability to Maps?

- » Multi-layer Test Access to:
 - › UI: Web AND Mobile
 - › API
 - › DB
 - › Email

Walk That Tight Rope!

- » Focus
 - › The bigger picture

- » Avoid Decomposition Distractions
 - › Evolve existing test scenarios

- » Balance
 - › Break Flows when data is “At Rest” in a verifiable state

- » Automation is Critical
 - › Do NOT Delay?
